**Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR)  
Hurricane Matthew Housing Program**

Volusia County Community Assistance is currently offering a program for owner-occupied homes that sustained damage from Hurricane Matthew, that have not yet been repaired. The program may provide funding for one of the following actions:

1. Replace pre-1994 mobile or manufactured homes on a rented lot;
2. Replace pre-1994 mobile or manufactured home on land you own;
3. Repair/replace site built, single family homes on land you own

**Preliminary eligibility criteria for the program include, but is not limited to:**

1. The home must be located in Volusia County.
2. The home must have sustained damage by Hurricane Matthew and said damage must still be in need of repair.
3. You must currently:
  - own the home and
  - have owned and used the home as your primary place of residence during the time of disaster.
4. Neither you nor the home may currently be involved in an active foreclosure and/or bankruptcy action.
5. The household income cannot exceed the Area Median Income (AMI) requirement below:

*Additional program eligibility requirements may apply.*

**Application process:**

1. All persons interested must submit an original Hurricane Matthew Housing Program application package and all applicable supporting documents.

2. Original applications should be mailed or hand delivered to the address listed on the application.
3. All submitted applications are reviewed to determine if the applicant and home meet the initial criteria.

The application will be used to identify potentially eligible homeowners. Submission or acceptance of an application package does not guarantee assistance through the program, therefore no commitment is made by either party.
