I. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Ben Johnson called the May 20, 2019 meeting of the Volusia County Public Safety Coordinating Council to order at 3:09 PM. Introductions were completed.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Johnson called for additions or corrections of the meeting minutes from the January 14, 2019 meeting. The motion was made to approve minutes and they were approved unanimously with no corrections.

III. REPORTS

A. JAIL REPORT –Mark A. Flowers

The jail is currently below its authorized capacity of 1,494, with a year-to-date ADP of 1,370. The lower the numbers in population, the higher the numbers in detox and mental health.

Hepatitis A - 2 active cases have been confirmed in the jail and is epidemic in Volusia County. It's not an epidemic in the jail.

Dr. Flowers discussed Corrections & Marchman acts. There is now a five (5) minute turnaround time for dropping Marchman acts off straight at the jail instead of the hospital. This will free up ambulances and law enforcement. They stay at the jail for 8 hours and then released. There are approximately 30 a week that go through the jail.

Mr. Johnson asked about measles/mumps. Dr. Flowers stated that there is no major concern about them.

Mr. Purdy mentioned rapid ID for people to help identify them.

B. CJIS REPORT – Greg Ledet

The zoned cabling network project for Corrections is almost completed and lays the groundwork for moving forward with other necessary technology upgrades.

The inmate phone/video visitation contract is headed to the vendor to be approved and signed. When the zoned cabling project has been completed, the inmate phone/video visitation project should be ready to begin installation.

The jail management system contract should go to council for funding approval in October.

The WebFOCUS report software upgrade has been completed, and Corrections and Court Services have begun developing in the new environment.

We have successfully beta-tested the scars, marks, and tattoo's browser based reporting application and have made it available to all law enforcement agencies in Volusia County. It has already been able to successfully identify a deceased suspect based only on his tattoos.

IV. OLD BUSINESS

Opioid treatment Centers-Chief Judge Zambrano is looking into seeing all facilities which house people with addiction. Corrections Treatment Diversion Program (CTDP).

V. NEW BUSINESS

Chief Judge Zambrano asked about how often to meet by statute and if the county is receiving funds from the state. Judge Zambrano will make a presentation at the next meeting for how the committee should go and who should be on it. He will also furnish the statute for the next meeting (951.26) and possibly a memo regarding the committee. Statute 394.657 is the general planning council statute for mental health.

Judge Zambrano wants the State Attorney's Office and Public Defenders offices to learn what CTDP is. The Chief Judge wants Joy Gerard (who is with Stewart Marchman Act) to train the attorneys on CTDP.

VI. GENERAL DISCUSSION

Mr. Johnson nominated Chief Judge Zambrano to become the chair for the PSCC committee.

Quanita May from Stewart Marchman Act and Capt. Scott Lee from the Daytona Beach Police Department are here to discuss the housing situation for the homeless/opioid people. Ms. Kay and Cpt. Lee will probably attend the next meeting. CTDP has exceeded their total number.

James Lymon, who has left DCF, will be going to the Hero's Mile. Chief Judge Zambrano wants Mr. Lymon to attend the next meeting and Nicole Sharbono will work on getting him here.

VII. ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at 4:07 PM. The next meeting is scheduled for June 24, 2019 at 3:00 p.m.
